This annual National Clogging Competition is an Invitational event only and culmination of the top 3 age division winners from NCHC competition sanction events series that begins each August 1 through July 31 of each year.

This year, the event is divided into 4 Division – Amateur division Pee wee through Junior, Amateur Division Senior through Adult, and repeated age divisions for Master Level Teams.

This two day event comprised over 235 teams, 50 duets, 300 solos, comprising over 450 competition dancers from GA, AR, MN, IN, SC, TN, FL, NC, WA, MO, NE, KY, OK, CO., AL, and IL.




All star dancers receive a t-shirt and they are invited to dance at the National Clogging Convention and be a part of the showcase. Other performing opportunities will be available throughout the year.

Cloggers from California, Florida, Texas, Canada, and many other states drove the challenging hazardous, Tail of the Dragon to be part of the celebration atop the Smoky Mountains. In past articles I wrote about the aurora of Fontana, that presence was strongly felt by all who attended. The hall was pre-

pared, decorated with various size cakes, with jovial volunteers greeting the arrivals. The volunteers were amazing, working dawn to way beyond dusk. Although these

Hard working, supportive, readily available, and a sense of humor unmatched, she is truly loved by all. Many attendees had to take US129 to get to Fontana Village. If you have not had the experience of driving on US129 "Tail of the Dragon" it is a harrowing 11 miles stretch of highway with 318 curves. In preparation for this workshop Naomi drove this road three times in one day, once at night to retrieve Barry Welsh from the airport. I might have asked Barry to hail a cab. Naomi taught two great country routines, and along with Barry a lesson in Swing Dancing, which was a big hit with the dancers. What a lucky lady she is surrounded by her "Boys".

He is a personable, quick witted young man. We wish him luck with his dancing pursuits.

Saturday evenings festivities started off with a bluegrass concert featuring The Grass Stains Band from West Virginia. This set the stage for a great night of dancing. The concert was followed by several outstanding exhibitions. But one demo overshadowed the rest ... move over "All That" make room for "ALL FAT"!!! Surpris-



ing the crowd or maybe I should say shocking the crowd, Naomi, Jeff, Chip, Scotty, and Barry took to the dance floor. They

On The Beat...

News from around the clogging world

On Sunday, September 2, 2012, twelve members of the Sims Country Cloggers of Dudley Shoals, NC participated in a kickoff celebration for the **Democratic National Convention** in Charlotte, NC at the Mint Museum. The party offered a "Taste of the Carolina's." Around 1,000 people were in attendance including delegates from several states. The delegates were from the five "home" states represented by President Obama and Vice President Biden which included Illinois, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Hawaii. The Cloggers were one of three groups selected from across the state to perform for the delegates. The Sims Country Cloggers were thanked and welcomed by Mayor of Charlotte Anthony Foxx. The cloggers got to rehearse and perform also with members of the West Charlotte High School marching band and Cheer Extreme stunt teams out of Kernersville, NC, these were the other groups selected to entertain at this event.



Members of the Sims Country Cloggers had to arrive at 11am that morning, go through security and orientation, and then we had lunch and rehearsed all afternoon until about 4:00pm. At 5:00pm the party began with music and throughout the night moments of "pop up" entertainment occurred, in which the Sims Country Cloggers participated in about 7 numbers. From clogging, to line dancing, to fun crowd songs like "Twist and Shout" our cloggers danced among many who had never seen clogging. Attendees thanked and applicable the dancers and asked questions after their performances.

The evening was wrapped up with a debriefing on the night's events. Each clogger was given a card that each of the attendees received that described the entertainment they saw at the event. All of the dancers also received a commemorative t-shirt and lanyard.
