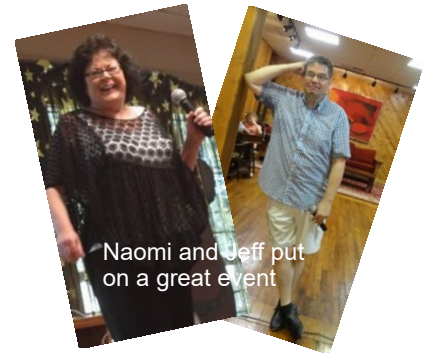

## FONTANA JAMBOREE 2015

The uniqueness of the Fontana Jamboree becomes apparent far before your arrival. The route that many take to the village is also one of a kind. The legendary "Tail of the Dragon" is a narrow road with 318 sharp curves in an eleven mile stretch. The tales told of trying to master driving on this road were highly entertaining. Like the Fontana Jamboree, this road leaves a lasting impression. The village is nestled in the Smoky Mountains at an elevation of 1,821 feet. There are no traffic lights, t-shirt stands, or golden arches. Here, the mountain does not have to compete to be seen. The lodge lobby provides a comfortable congregating area, with a noteworthy stone fireplace, and a bank of windows overlooking the mountain. Others prefer to stay in one of the cozy cabins that are scattered throughout the village. The linens, cookware, and porch rocking chairs are supplied. These cabins are great for dinner gatherings, and late night campfires. Nearby, Fontana Lake is over 400 feet deep, and has 238 miles of shoreline. Boat rentals are available as well as guided tours. Undoubtedly, this is one of the most tranquil places you will ever visit. The scenery is absolutely breathtaking! No cell phone service adds to the peacefulness of the area. A whole weekend without Facebook or text messaging!

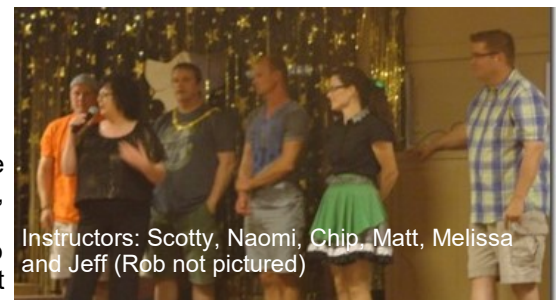

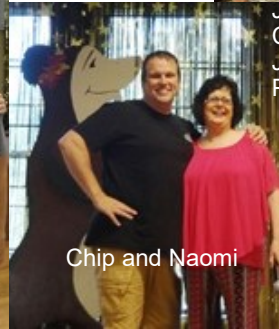

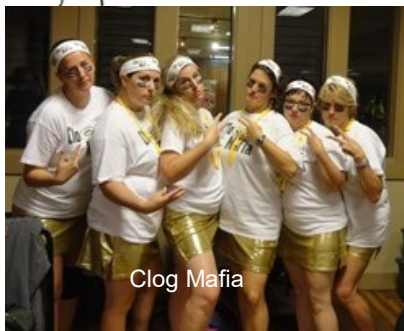
