costume contest added spice to the



The resort where Convention will be held is absolutely amazing! It is VERY family oriented & family friendly, so your whole family could attend & find something to do even if they do not clog!



When the Executive Committee visited the resort in early March to finalize halls, etc, we were treated to a tour of the grounds & hotel, after having a wonderful breakfast! While touring the grounds, we saw families on bicycles all over the place. Turns out, there are bikes for riding parked at different locations on the grounds. There is no charge for the bikes - if they are there & you'd like to ride, you can do so! Children must have a helmet but adults can get away without.



There are so many activities right at the resort, you may never want to leave! (We do hope you'll want to join us Friday evening tho for our outing to the River Walk for the Christmas parade!).

There is a 27-hole Golf Course, a 5-acre water park that includes a lazy river, water slide & multiple pools, a Spa!, Flow Rider, movies on the lawn, s'mores by the fire, jogging trails & nature trail. If you decide to venture away from the resort, Sea World Texas is just 1.5 miles away. Then there's the famous River Walk & of course the Alamo!

As you register at the front desk you'll notice an events board. On that are the day's activities. Things such as wildlife feeding

Columbia's Jamil Temple echoed with the sounds of music and dancing feet from Saturday morning until late Saturday night, as more than 1,000 competitors took part in the Capital City Clogging Classic.

"It's just so awesome to see so many good dancers and people who love clogging," said 9-year-old clogger Amy Payne. "You get to meet new friends and we all have something to talk about."

Teams from Virginia, Tennessee, and Georgia joined individuals and groups from the Midlands and all over South Carolina for the event, hosted by <u>Capital City Clogging Co.</u>

The cloggers included men and women and boys and girls ranging from 2-year-olds all the way to adults. Emcee Clay Vassey was kept busy through the long day, with 155 teams taking part in various age divisions and categories such as traditional line form, contemporary, a capella, and open hoedown.

The dancers performed as solo acts and duos as well as in groups, with some groups as small as three and others made up of dozens on stage at once.

The event provided a boost for local businesses, with many out-of-town cloggers and their parents and coaches staying overnight, and many more coming and going at local restaurants throughout the day.

A panel of judges kept score throughout the day, and awarded prizes for entertainment and sportsmanship. A "parent of the day" prize was also included to recognize those who do so much to support the dancers.
